IV. LGBTQIA2+ Pride Month Presentation	Dylan and Chris started their Pride Presentation highlighting some important protests in LGBTQIA2+ history and delved more into these events and what they signified to the community as well as what we know as Pride today.	

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	<ul> <li>They shared a video about Drag Queen Panti Bliss showing the adversity that the gay community faces and how that impacts personal identity .</li> <li>Dylan and Chris shared that a lot of people know about Stonewall but there is a lot of movements before that and that gay culture and history is constantly evolving and moving forward.</li> <li>Pride Background <ul> <li>It didn't start with Stonewall, there was plenty of other Pride uprisings before Stonewall</li> <li>The oldest documented evidence of same-sex relationships were found in Ancient Egypt dating back to approxiamentaly 2400 BCE. Prehistoric graves 5000 years ago contained biologically male skeleetons with womens clothing and grave goods.</li> <li>Henry Gerber founded Chicago's Society for Human Rights in 1924, the first gay rights organization, after witnessing a German Homosexual emancipation movement.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
