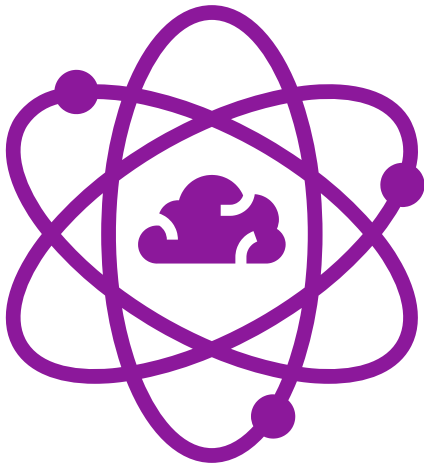


COVID-19 Attitudes and Behaviors of Riverside County Residents

Riverside University Health System – Public Health (RUHS – Public Health) and Health Assessment and Research for Communities (HARC) conducted a study in 2021 about COVID-19 needs among Riverside County adults. HARC collected data in English and Spanish from more than 9,200 randomly selected adults between September 2021 and November 2021. The survey asked questions about attitudes and behaviors towards COVID-19, as well as pandemic experiences and basic needs.

This project was supported by Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity Enhancing Detection funds and is provided by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Riverside County residents were asked if after receiving the COVID-19 vaccine would they continue certain behaviors. Participants answered as follows.

56% of participants plan to **continue** to frequently wash or sanitize hands even after the pandemic



30% of participants plan to **discontinue** to frequently wash or sanitize hands once the pandemic ends

10% of participants plan to **discontinue** wearing face masks in public once they are vaccinated.



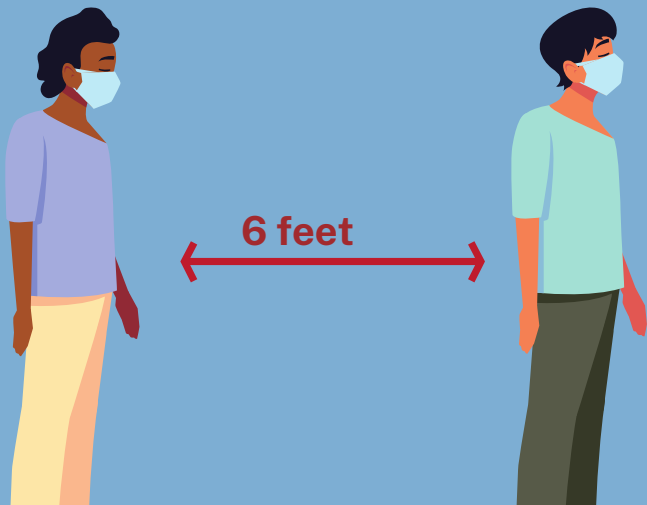
55% of participants plan to **discontinue** wearing face masks in public once the pandemic ends.



16% of participants plan to **continue** wearing face masks in public even after the pandemic ends.

13% of participants plan to **continue** social distancing even after the pandemic ends

43% of participants plan to **continue** social distancing until the pandemic ends



13% of participants plan to **discontinue** social distancing once they are vaccinated
