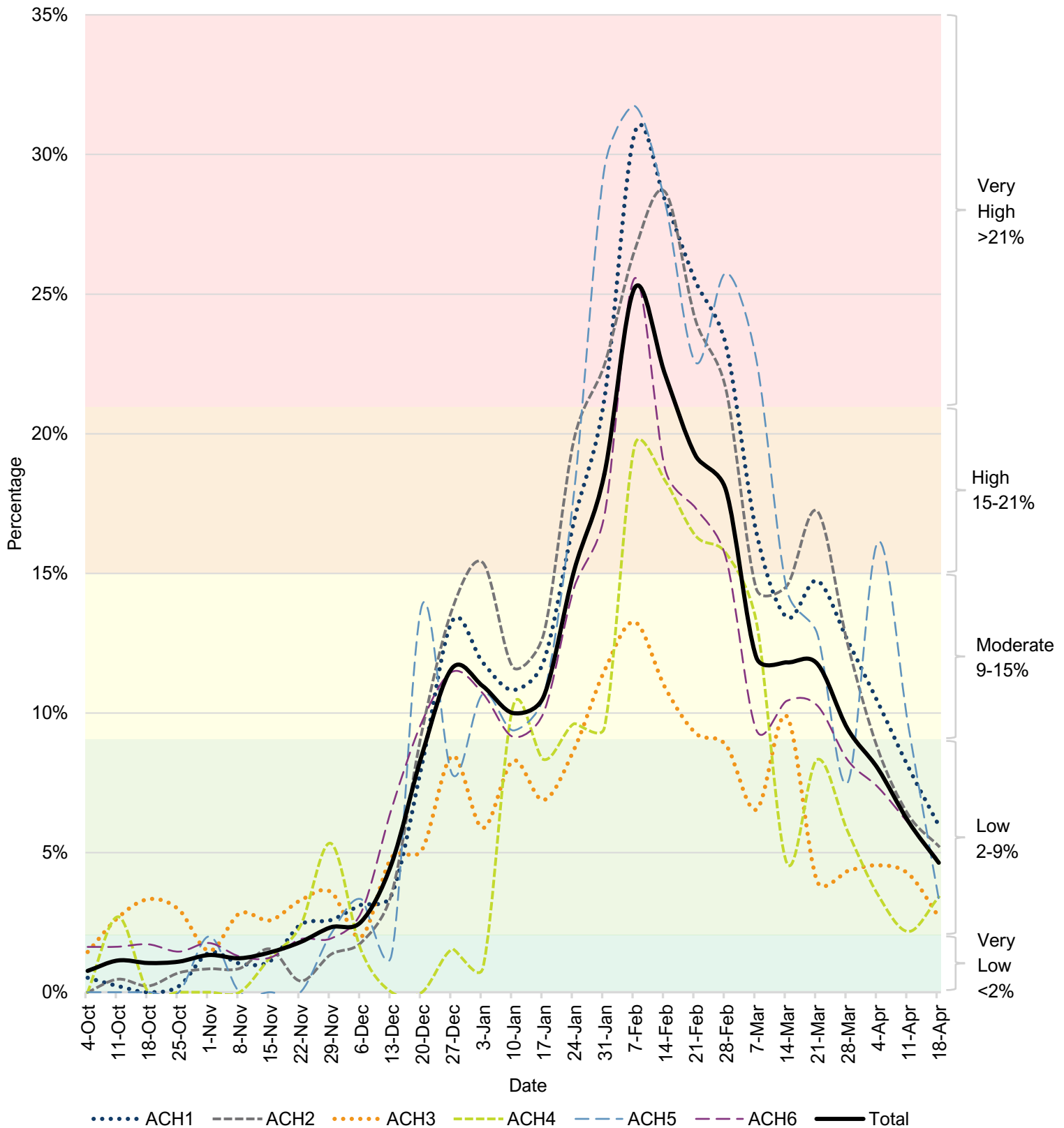


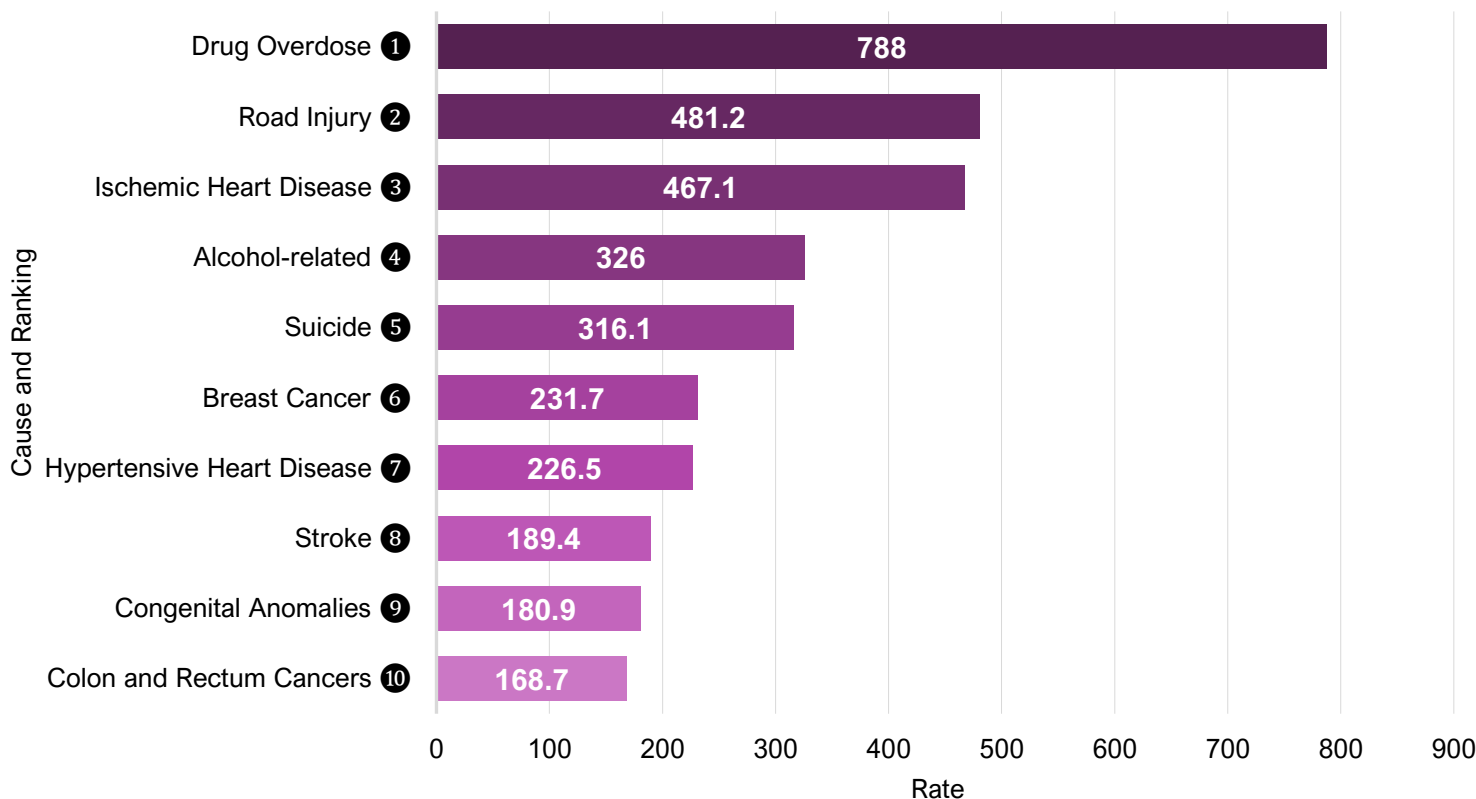
Influenza Laboratory Test Positivity by Acute Care Hospital (ACH), 2025-2026 Season

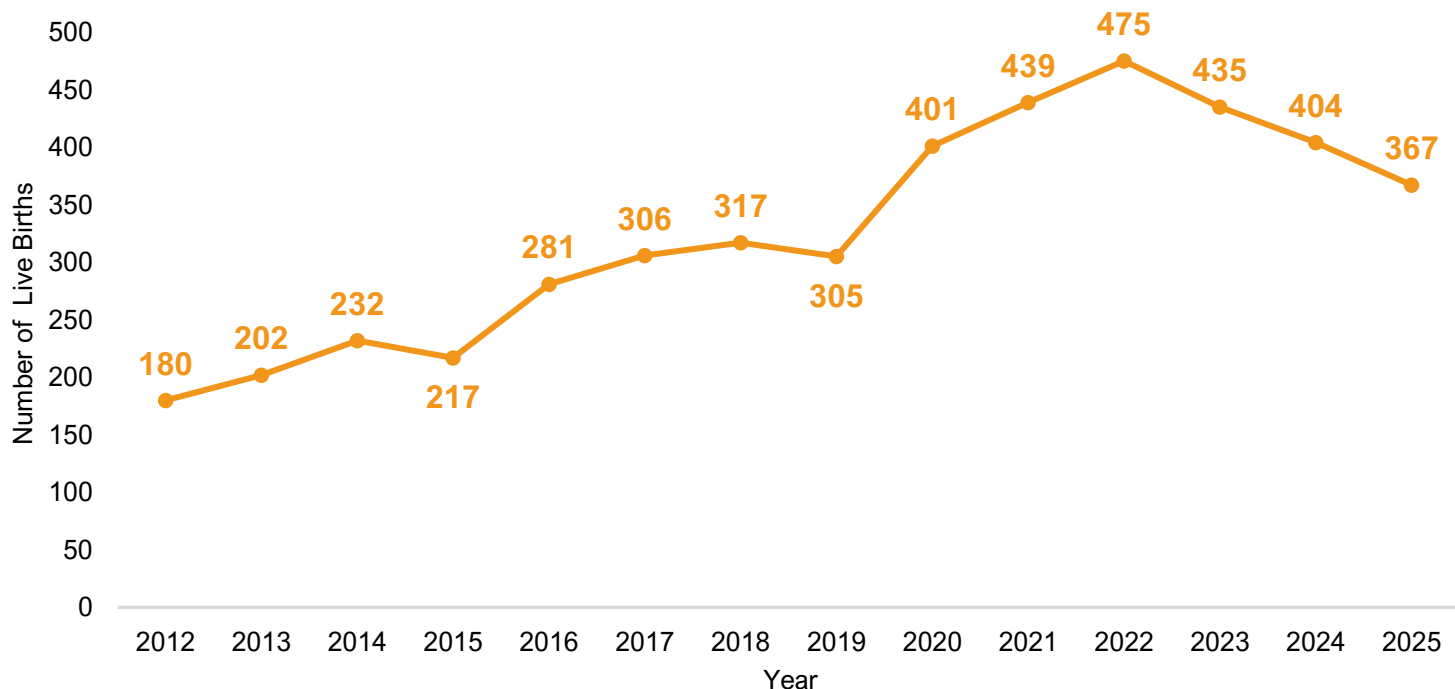
Top 10 Causes of Premature Mortality (Years of Life Lost), Riverside County, 2024

Notes: Years of Life Lost (YLL) estimates the years of potential life lost due to premature deaths.

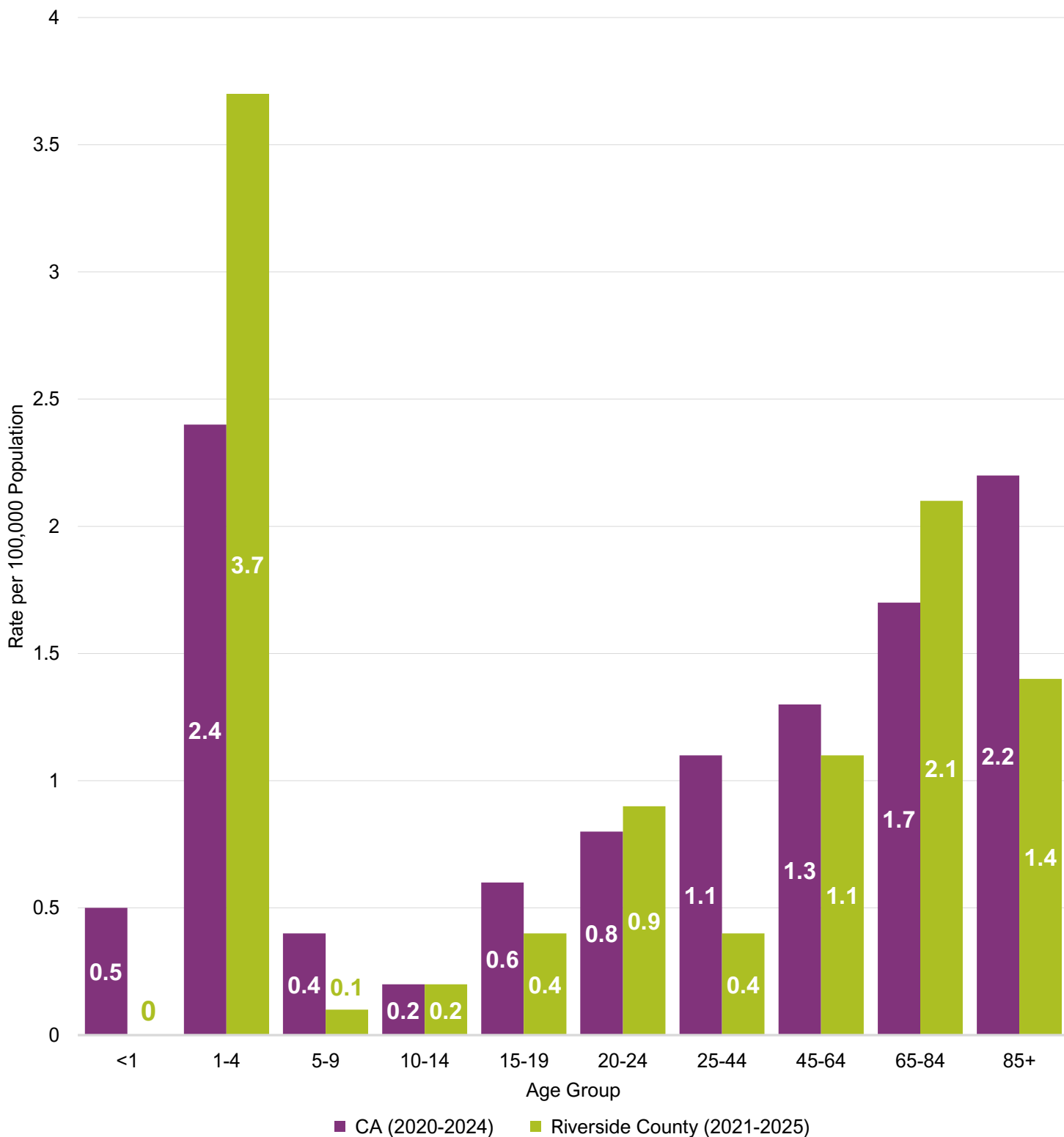
Post-COVID Rise in Out-of-Hospital Births Across Riverside County (2012-2025*)
