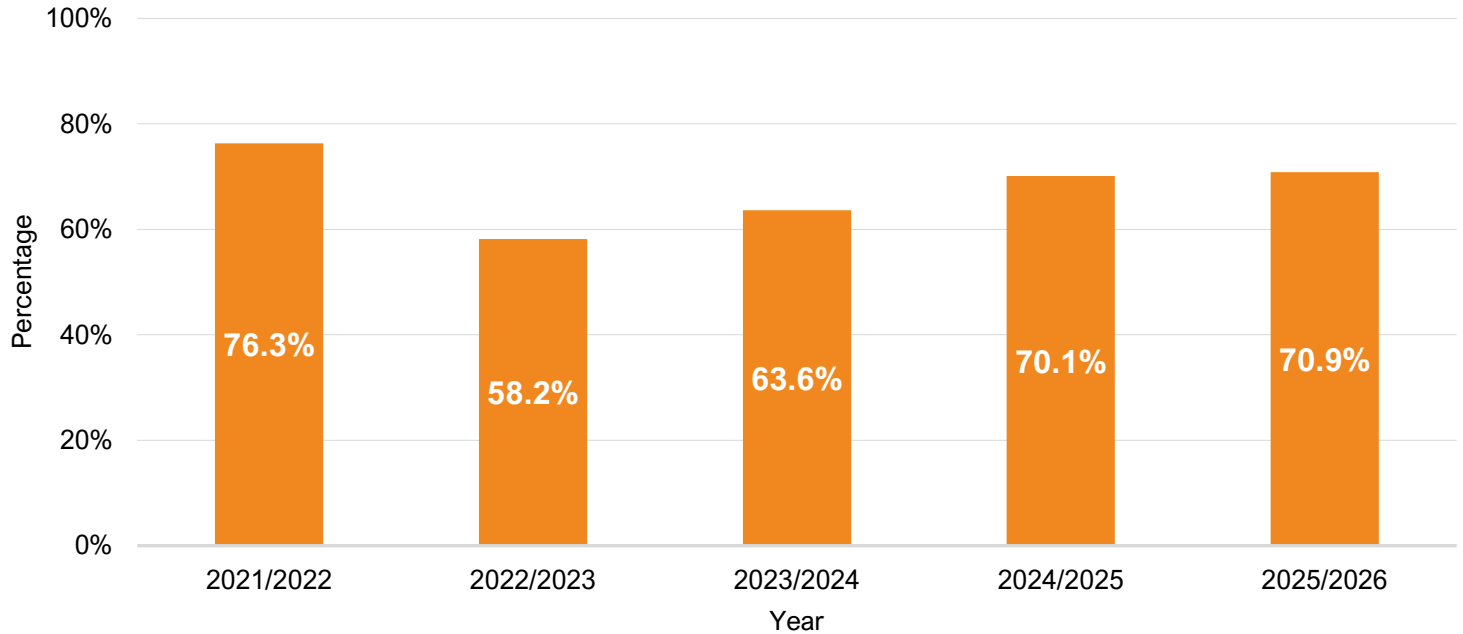


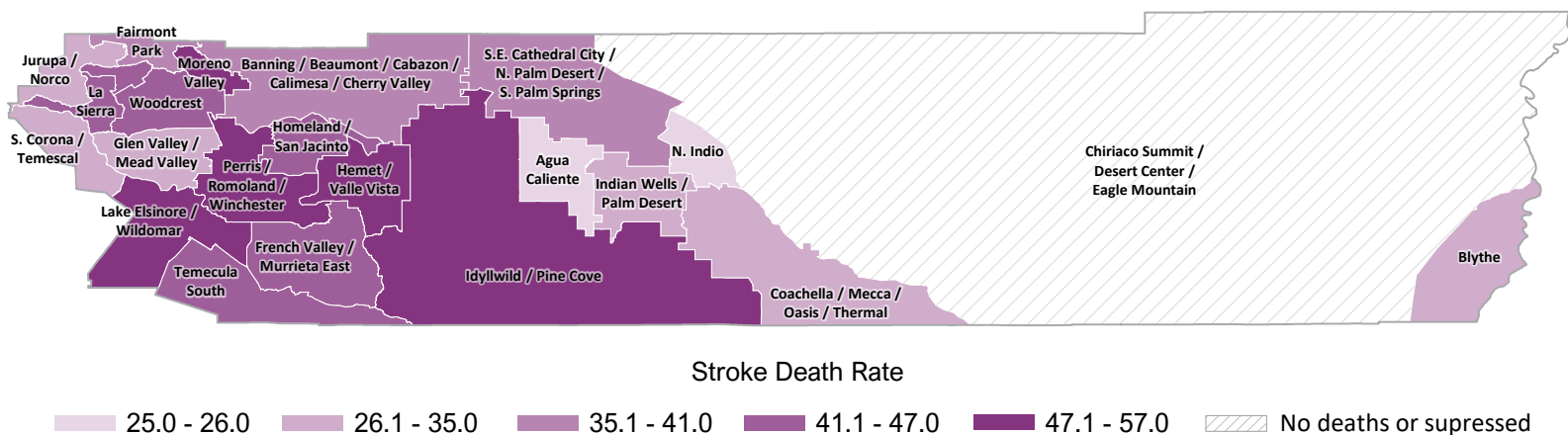

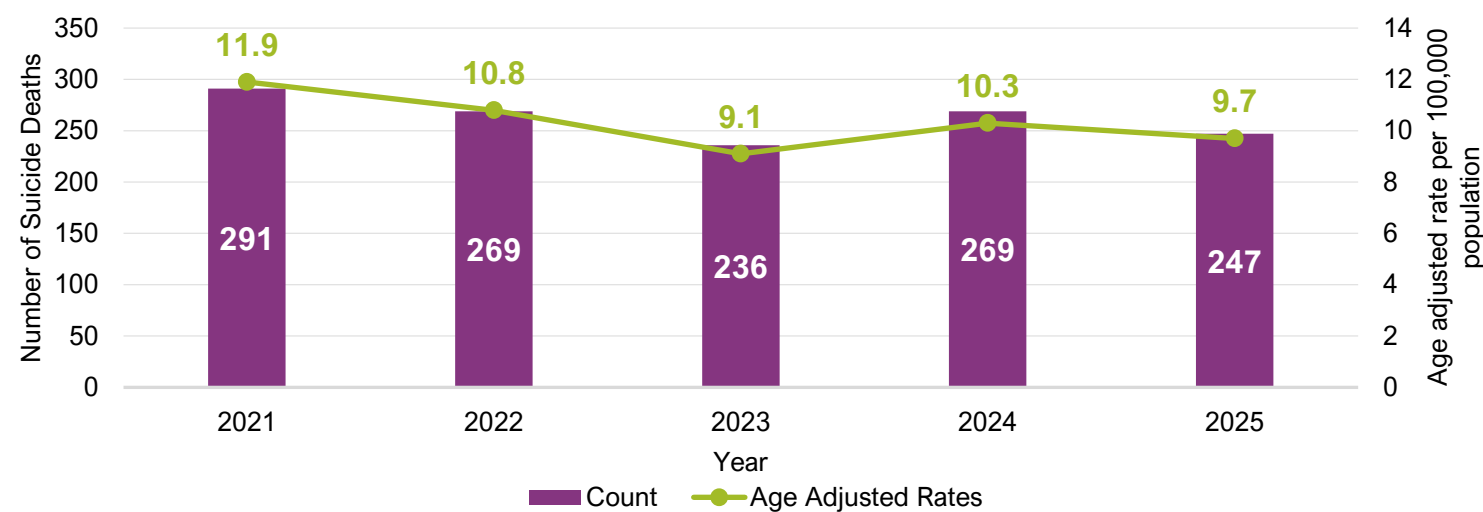
## Age-Adjusted Death Rate from Stroke in 2020-2024 by Community in Riverside County

Differences in exposures throughout the county may contribute to differences in Stroke Death Rates throughout the county. Notes: Among California Counties, Riverside County ranked third highest in response of residents as "very worried" or "moderately worried" to the question: "How worried are you that extreme heat might harm your local area?"

Methodology note: Public worry about extreme heat is estimated using nationally representative survey data collected between 2018 and 2022. The percentage of residents worried about extreme heat in each county is modeled using multilevel regression with poststratification (MRP), a standard method for producing small-area estimates from survey data.
