Adolescent Family Life Program (AFLP)

The overall goal of the AFLP is to address the health, social, educational, and economic challenges of expecting and parenting youth and their families. Through home visitation, AFLP provides youth with the resources to achieve the goals increasing access and use of needed services, increased social and emotional support, increasing educational attainment, and improving pregnancy planning and spacing.

<u>Eligibility Requirements:</u> expectant and/or parenting youth up to 21 years of age.







Black Infant Health (BIH) Program

The BIH Program aims to decrease the high rates of infant and maternal mortality among African American mothers and babies using a group-based approach and client-centered case management. This powerful combination serves to help women enhance life skills, learn proven strategies to reduce stress, building social support, and empower them to make behavioral changes that lead to living a healthier life to improve birth outcomes.

Eligibility requirements: African American identifying women, 16 years of age or older, and pregnant or parenting up to six months postpartum.



Field Nursing Services

The Public Health Field Nurse is a Registered Nurse certified in Public Health who helps individuals and families prevent illness, maintain, and achieve good health: Comprehensive Assessments, Teaching/Education, Referral and Linkage to Services and Case Management.

Eligibility Requirements: pregnancy up adult/senior for healthcare needs

Healthy Families America (HFA) Program

HFA is an evidence-based home visiting program of Prevent Child Abuse America'. By supporting parents in the home, HFA focuses on building nurturing, safe and trusting relationships between caregiver and child to maximize opportunities for their children and parents to reach their full potential.

<u>Eligibility Requirements:</u> This program is available for women who are highrisk clients during pregnancy or within the first 3 months of the infant's birth.



Nurse Family Partnership (NFP) Program

NFP is an evidenced-based nurse home visitation program that improves the health, well-being and self-sufficiency of low-income, first-time parents and their children. The mother, father and child are visited in their home regularly by a public health nurse over a period of 2 years. We help the new mom become a better parent and provide referrals to healthcare, childcare, job training, and other supportive services.

<u>Eligibility Requirements:</u> First time mothers, 28 weeks pregnant or less.
