Vision Statement: "Empowering African American women, children and families for a healthier tomorrow."

Services:

- Supportive prenatal and postpartum group sessions that provide support, empowerment and reduce stress.
- Public Health Nurse and Medical Social Worker support.
- Individual Client Plans / Life Plans to help mothers plan their future.
- Transportation assistance (gas cards, bus passes).
- Referrals to services and resources within the community.

Qualifications:

- Self-identify as a Black woman.
- Must be 16 years of age or older.
- Be pregnant or up to 6 months postpartum.
- Live in Riverside County.



BIH continues to celebrate our mom's empowering pregnancy journeys at our in-person prenatal baby shower. This event is held at the completion of a 10-week group series. All moms who attend get to connect with others through games, love and support. They are also provided with resources and other incentives as we embrace each other's journey.
