

VIOLENCE PREVENTION

Community Survey Results

6,200 Riverside County residents were randomly selected to complete a survey on community safety. The survey asked questions about perceived safety, issues of concern, and experiences with violence.

Violence topics include: assault, burglary, child safety, gun violence, hate crime, online abuse/harassment, online scam/fraud, road rage/speeding, robbery, sexual assault/rape, suicidal thoughts/attempt, violence inside the home, violence between romantic partners.


Hispanic/Latino, and 32% White, non-Hispanic

PERCEIVED SAFETY

during the day and night

- 80% of residents feel safe during the day.
- · 55% of residents feel safe at night.



Reasons for Feeling Unsafe at Night

The presence of persons experiencing homelessness & drugs/people using drugs.

PERCEIVED PROBLEMS IN THE COMMUNITY

The top five issues that residents perceive as a problem (either big, medium, or small) include:

PERSONAL EXPERIENCES WITH VIOLENCE

residents have either

Types of Violence Experienced

Violence experienced most often by residents, or someone they know includes:

Road rage/speeding Burglary/theft

IMPACT ON QUALITY OF LIFE

Experiencing violence often had a significant impact on the victim's quality of life:



Sexual assault or rape victims were affected a lot



Violence in the home victims were affected a lot



Suicidal thoughts or attempt victims were affected a lot

REASONS FOR NOT SEEKING HELP

Victims who didn't seek help were asked why:

Victims of assault, burglary, gun violence, hate crime, online abuse/harassment, online scam/fraud, road rage/ speeding, and robbery

> Didn't feel help was needed

Victims of sexual assault/rape or violence inside the home

Felt shame or embarassment






